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Modern Slavery Policy

VEEM Ltd is committed to conducting business ethically and with integrity. This policy outlines our commitment to preventing and addressing modern slavery risks within our operations and supply chains in compliance with the Modern Slavery Act 2018 (Cth).

VEEM's commitment:

- We will not tolerate modern slavery in any form, including forced labour, human trafficking, child labour, and exploitative working conditions.
- We will uphold fair and ethical workplace practices, ensuring compliance with Australian workplace laws.
- We expect our suppliers and business partners to adhere to the same standards and actively assess and mitigate modern slavery risks.

We will take reasonable steps to identify and assess the risks of modern slavery within our operations and supply chain. This may include:

- Conducting risk assessments to identify high-risk areas.
- Engaging with suppliers to understand their labour practices and ethical standards.
- Monitoring for signs of modern slavery.

This policy will be reviewed and updated regularly to ensure its effectiveness.

This policy applies to all directors, officers and employees of VEEM Ltd.
